Is poblachtach ar feadh a shaoil é John Brady agus tá sé ina chomhairleoir de chuid Chill Mhantáin ón mbliain 2004. D'oibrigh John go dícheallach leis an bpáirtí a fhorbairt ag leibhéal na gCumann, na gComhairlí Ceantair agus na gCúigí. Ar fud obair John sa pháirtí, tá sé ina fhear feachtais gníomhach ag an leibhéal áitiúil agus náisiúnta araon. Tá sé i mbun feachtais ar chuid mhór saincheisteanna ar nós cúram sláinte, saincheisteanna frithdhrugaí, tithíochta agus soláthairtí neamhleora seirbhísí dóiteáin agus cuid mhór saincheisteanna eile den chineál sin. Tá bród ar John as a bheith ina ghníomhaíoch polaitiúil lonnaithe sa phobal agus, mar gheall air sin, imríonn sé ról gníomhach i ngrúpaí éagsúla pobail agus spóirt. Creideann John gur cheart ár bpobail a choinneáil go láidir inár n-intinn agus beartais nua á gceapadh. Creideann John go bhfuil sé sin ag teastáil, chomh maith leis an gcaighdeán ceart ceannaireachta, chun ár dtír a chur chun feabhais. Cé gur beag nár éirigh leis suíochán a bhuachan in olltoghchán 2011, leanann John air ról ríthábhachtach a imirt i Sinn Féin a fhorbairt.

Rose Conway-Walsh

Mayo Sinn Féin Councillor Rose Conway-Walsh is regarded in her native county as a fearless and outspoken advocate for her constituents, having already cut a swathe through short-lived triumphalism of the government party after the 2011 general election. Married, with two young children, Rose, a former public relations officer, balances her roles as a home-maker and manager of a community development project. She is also a political activist with a lifelong commitment to education, having recently been awarded a BA in Public Management and a Masters in Local Government.



Born into west Mayo, an area with a proud republican history and the home of hunger striker Seán McNeela, Rose, a lifelong republican, was involved in the campaigns in support of the Hunger Strikers in 1981. Like countless others before and after, she was forced to take the boat to London in search of work at 19. Rose returned to Ireland in the late 1990s and immediately started up where she left off in

republican politics in Mayo.

Following on from her role along with Pearse Doherty TD in Sinn Féin's report 'Awakening the West: Overcoming Social and Economic Inequality', Rose takes a unique perspective and understanding of the needs and requirements of what is the most socially and economically deprived region on the island, the West of Ireland, to the Ard Chomhairle. Rooted within her community, Rose knows the issues that impact on the lives and welfare of the people in the West.

Embedded in the statutory and voluntary network in the Western region, Rose brings to the Ard Chomhairle a proven commitment and republican track record on the issues that have the greatest significance for her region. With an appeal that can reach out to those sections of the electorate who do not traditionally vote Sinn Féin, Rose plays a significant part in developing and growing Sinn Féin support in the West.

Meastar ina contae dhúchais gur tacaí neamheaglach díreach lena toghthóirí í Comhairleoir Shinn Féin do Mhaigh Eo, Rose Conway-Walsh, toisc go ndearna sí dochar do chaithréimeachas pháirtí an rialtais tar éis olltoghchán 2011. Tá Rose pósta agus tá beirt leanaí óga aici, is iar-oifigeach caidrimh phoiblí í a chothromaíonn a ról mar chúramaí baile agus bainisteoir de thionscadal forbartha pobail. Is gníomhaíoch polaitiúil í freisin a bhfuil tiomantas ar feadh a saoil aici d'oideachas, agus bronnadh BA i mBainistíocht Phoiblí agus Céim Mháistreachta i rialtas áitiúil uirthi le déanaí.

Rugadh i Maigh Eo Thiar í, ar ceantar é ag a bhfuil stair bhródúil phoblachtach agus atá mar bhaile don stailceoir ocrais Sean McNeela, bhí baint ag Rose, ar poblachtach ar feadh a saoil í, leis na feachtais a thug tacaíocht do na stailceoirí ocrais i 1981. Cosúil leis an iomarca duine roimpi agus ina diaidh, cuireadh iallach uirthi dul ar bhád go Londain ar lorg oibre agus í 19 mbliana d'aois. D'fhill Rose ar Éirinn go mall sna 1990í agus thosaigh sí gan mhoill mar a bhí sí roimhe i bpolaitíocht phoblachtach i Maigh Eo.

Tar éis a ról i dteannta Pearse Doherty TD i bhFeachtas Shinn Féin 'An tIarthar ina Dhúiseacht', tógann Rose dearcadh agus tuiscint leithleach ar na riachtanais agus ar na ceanglais atá ag an réigiún is díothaí ón taobh sóisialta agus eacnamaíoch de ar an oileán, is é sin Iarthar na hÉireann, chuig an Ard-Chomhairle. Neadaithe laistigh dá pobal, tá eolas ag Rose ar na saincheisteanna a imríonn tionchar ar shaol agus leas na ndaoine san Iarthar.

Neadaithe laistigh den ghréasán reachtúil agus deonach i réigiún an Iarthair, tugann Rose tiomantas agus cuntas teiste poblachtach cruthaithe maidir leis na saincheisteanna is mó tábhacht dá réigiún don Ard-Chomhairle. Toisc go bhfuil mealltacht aici a fhéadann síneadh do na codanna sin de na toghthóirí nach vótálann do Shinn Féin go traidisiúnta, imríonn Rose páirt shuntasach i bhforbairt agus i bhfás a dhéanamh ar Shinn Féin san Iarthar.

David Cullinane

David Cullinane is the Sinn Féin Group Leader in the Seanad (having been elected on the Labour Panel in 2011) as well as being party spokesperson on Political Reform and Workers' Rights. He stood as the Sinn Féin candidate in the general election in 2011 and polled 5,342 first-preference votes.



As a public representative, David has earned a reputation as an honest, hard-working and committed campaigner on behalf of the people of Waterford through his time as a city councillor since 2004, and subsequently as a senator. He also stood as a candidate for Ireland South in the 2004 European Election, polling 32,643 first-preferences. During the course of his time as a senator, he has been outspoken in particular on the need to protect workers in these difficult times and was responsible for the drafting of the Protection of Employees (Amendment) Bill 2012.

David has also highlighted the growing difficulties of unemployment in the South-East and has in recent years published comprehensive proposals aimed at getting Waterford people back to work. He has been appointed as the Special Rapporteur for the Joint Oireachtas Committee on Jobs, Enterprise and Innovation to develop an Economic Development Strategy for the South-East and has travelled the region to meet over 60 groups and organisations.

David Cullinane is married to Kathleen Funchion and has two sons, Emmet and Finn.

Is é David Cullinane Ceannaire Ghrúpa Shinn Féin sa Seanad, i ndiaidh gur toghadh é ar an bPainéal Oibre sa bhliain 2011, chomh maith le bheith ina Urlabharí Páirtí ar Athchóiriú Polaitiúil agus Cearta Oibrithe. Sheas sé mar Iarrthóir Shinn Féin san Olltoghchán sa bhliain 2011 agus bhain sé 5,342 vóta de chéad rogha.

Mar ionadaí poiblí, tá clú bainte amach ag David mar fheachtasóir macánta, díograiseach agus tiomanta thar ceann mhuintir Phort Láirge mar gheall ar an am a chaith sé mar Chomhairleoir Cathrach ón mbliain 2004, agus ina dhiaidh sin mar Sheanadóir. Sheas sé mar Iarrthóir freisin do Dheisceart Éireann i dToghchán na hEorpa 2004, agus d'éirigh leis 32,643 vóta de chéad rogha a bhaint amach. Le linn a thréimhse mar Sheanadóir, labhair sé amach go neamhbhalbh go háirithe ar an ngá le hoibrithe a chosaint in am seo an ghá, agus bhí sé féin freagrach as an mBille um Chosaint Oibrithe (Leasú) 2012 a dhréachtú.

Léirigh David chomh maith na deacrachtaí móra a bhaineann leis an dífhostaíocht san Oirdheisceart agus le cúpla bliain anuas, d'fhoilsigh sé moltaí cuimsitheacha dírithe ar mhuintir Phort Láirge a chur ar ais ag obair. Ceapadh é mar Rapóirtéir Speisialta do Chomhchoiste an Oireachais faoi Phoist, Fhiontar agus Nuálaíocht chun Straitéis

Forbartha Eacnamaíche a fhorbairt don Oirdheisceart agus thaistil sé an réigiún agus bhuail sé le breis agus 60 grúpa agus eagraíocht.

Tá David Cullinane pósta ar Kathleen Funchion agus tá beirt mhac acu, Emmet agus Finn.

Máire Devine

Máire Devine is Sinn Féin's councillor for Tallaght Central (Dublin South-West) and was elected to the Ard Chomhairle for the first time last year.

Máire lives in Dublin and is married with three children. She works tirelessly for the constituency and the people that have lost so much in this appalling economic crisis. Máire is an elected representative on many local and national fora which include the Joint Policing Forum, the Leinster Health Forum and numerous action committees. Her hard work has highlighted horrendous anti-community issues and she has engaged in TV debates and public meetings to emphasise the urgent need for resources and assistance for the ordinary families whose lives have been devastated by this Government's weak governance. Máire is also involved at a strategic level in several committees for South Dublin.

She has worked hard in promoting our party and our agenda and was a member of the delegation to Cuba in 2010.

Máire is a qualified Mental Health Nurse and has worked in Brighton, Belfast and Dublin. She was the elected branch secretary for her nursing union. She holds a BA in Politics and History along with a Post Grad in Management from the University of Ulster.

Máire comes from a proud republican Dublin background and it is those core republican values that underpin and inform her daily life.

Tá Máire ina cónaí i mBaile Átha Cliath agus tá sí pósta agus triúr páistí aici. Oibríonn sí gan stad ná staonadh don Dáilcheantar agus do na daoine a bhfuil an oiread sin caillte acu le linn na géarchéime uafasaí geilleagaraí seo. Ionadaí tofa is ea Máire ar chuid mhór Fóram áitiúil agus náisiúnta lena n-áirítear an Comhfhóram Póilíneachta, Fóram Sláinte Laighin agus roinnt mhaith Coistí Gníomhaíochta. Mar gheall ar a cuid oibre tugadh chun solais ceisteanna uafásacha frith-phobail agus ghlac sí páirt i ndíospóireachtaí teilifíse agus i gCruinnithe Poiblí chun béim a chur ar an ngéarghá práinneach atá ann le haghaidh acmhainní agus cúnaimh do ghnáth-theaghlaigh a bhfuil saolta s'acu scriosta mar gheall ar dhrochrialú an Rialtais. Tá baint ag Máire ar leibhéil straitéiseach le roinnt Coistí i mBaile Átha Cliath theas.

D'oibrigh sé go dian dícheallach chun ár bPáirtí agus ár gclár a chur chun tosaigh agus bhí sí ina bhall den toscaireacht a chuaigh go Cúba sa bhliain 2010.



Banaltra cháilithe Mheabhairshláinte is ea Máire agus d'oibrigh sí in Brighton, i mBéal Feirste agus i mBaile Átha Cliath. Toghadh í mar Rúnaí Craoibhe dá gCeardchumann Banaltrachta. Tá BA sa Pholaitíocht agus sa Stair aici agus larchéim sa Bhainistíocht ó Ollscoil Uladh.

Is as cúla bródúil Poblachtach i mBaile Átha Cliath í Máire agus is iad na croíluachanna poblachtacha sin atá mar bhonn taca lena saol laethúil.

Pearse Doherty

Pearse Doherty TD is 35 years of age and is from Gweedore in the Donegal Gaeltacht. Elected as Sinn Féin's first senator in 2007, he won the Donegal South-West by-election which he had forced with a High Court action against the Government. He retained his seat with a poll-topping performance in the general election in 2011.

Pearse has served on the national executive of Ógra Shinn Féin and on the Sinn Féin Ard Chomhairle. He is now the party's spokesperson on Finance.

Tá Pearse Doherty TD 35 bliain d'aois. Is as Gaoth Dobhair i nGaeltacht Thír Chonaill dó. Tofa mar an chéad Seanadóir de chuid Shinn Féin i 2007, bhuaigh sé fothoghchán Dhún na nGall Thiar Theas, fothoghchán a d'éiligh sé le himeacht san Ard-Chúirt in aghaidh an rialtais. Choinnigh sé a shuíochán trí na vótaí is mó a fháil san olltoghchán i 2011.

D'fhóin Pearse ar fheidhmeannas náisiúnta Ógra Shinn Féin agus ar Ard-Chomhairle Shinn Féin. Is eisean urlabhraí an pháirtí ar Airgeadas anois.



Deirdre Hargey

Deirdre Hargey is a councillor on Belfast City Council and chairs the council's Strategic Policy & Resources Committee. She has been a member of the party for 10 years and comes from a strong republican family.

Deirdre is a community activist, sitting on a number of cross-community forums and area development boards. She is also a Sinn Féin representative on the South and East Belfast Policing and Community Safety Partnerships (PCSPs). Her activism has seen her involved in many issues such as social housing, youth, gender equality, physical and economic regeneration while engaging with working-class unionist communities around these issues.

Tá Deirdre Hargey ina Comhairleoir reatha i gComhairle Cathrach Bhéal Feirste agus déanann sí cathaoirleacht ar an gcoiste um Beartas Straitéiseach agus Acmhainní de chuid na comhairle. Tá sí ina ball den Pháirtí le 10 mbliana anuas agus tógadh i gclann phoblachtach láidir í.

Alex Maskey

Alex Maskey is a member of the Ard Chomhairle and has been an elected representative for Sinn Féin since 1983, including being elected the first Sinn Féin Mayor of Belfast in 2002. Over many years Alex has also represented the party in negotiations, on the Policing Board and within the unionist outreach programme. Alex was re-elected in 2011 to the Assembly as MLA for South Belfast. Following the election he was appointed Chairperson of the Assembly Social Development Committee. He is the party spokesperson on Social Development and is also a member of the OFM/dFM Committee. Alex continues to represent the party locally, nationally and internationally, and with other comrades plays a particular ongoing role in the Basque peace process.



Tá Alex Maskey ina bhall reatha den Ard-Chomhairle agus ina ionadaí tofa de chuid Shinn Féin ón mbliain 1983 agus ba é an chéad bhall de Shinn Féin a toghadh ina Mheára ar Bhéal Feirste. Rinneadh Alex a thoghadh san athuair sa bhliain 2011 ar an Tionól mar MLA do Bhéal Feirste Theas. I ndiaidh an toghcháin, ceapadh mar Chathaoirleach ar Choise an Tionóil um Forbairt Shóisialta é, tá sé mar urlabhra an pháirtí ar Fhorbairt Shóisialta agus tá sé ina bhall de Choiste OFM/dFM. Leanann Alex d'ionadaíocht a dhéanamh ar an bpáirtí ar leibhéal áitiúil, go Náisiúnta agus go hIdirnáisiúnta agus go sonrach le comrádaithe eile imríonn sé ról leanúnach i bpróiseas na síochána i dTír na mBascach.

Martin McGuinness

Martin McGuinness was born in 1950. He became involved in the Civil Rights Movement in Derry after October 5th 1968 and joined Sinn Féin in 1970. Since Martin was elected to the Ard Chomhairle of Sinn Féin. He has played a major role in promoting and supporting the strategy of the current peace process.

Martin married his wife Bernie in 1974. They have four children, two girls and two boys. Martin McGuinness is Sinn Féin's Chief Negotiator and he has actively assisted other fledgling peace processes throughout the world, including in Sri Lanka and Iraq. Martin has represented Sinn Féin in high-level discussions with political leaders in Europe as well as America.



In 1997, Martin was elected MP for the Mid-Ulster constituency and re-elected again in 2001 and 2005.

In 1998 and 2003, he was elected to the Assembly for the same

constituency. He became Minister for Education in the new Assembly in November 1999 and was widely acclaimed for his work.

In May 2007, Martin was appointed as joint First Minister in the local Executive. Since then, his leadership at home has been unparalleled. Since entering the Office of First and deputy First Minister alongside Gerry Kelly, Martin has continued to work tirelessly in delivering for citizens across the North, including attracting direct economic investment through hosting major economic investment conferences, building international relations, and actively tackling sectarianism, racism and bigotry, as well as developing cross-community relations.

Rugadh Martin McGuinness i 1950. Ghlac sé páirt sa Ghluaiseacht Cearta Sibhialta i nDoire tar éis an 5 Deireadh Fómhair, 1968, agus d'éirigh sé ina bhall de Shinn Féin i 1970. Ó toghadh Martin ar Ard-Chomhairle Shinn Féin i leith, d'imir sé ról mór i dtacú le straitéis an phróisis síochána reatha agus ina cur chun cinn.

Phós Martin a bhean chéile, Bernie, i 1974. Tá ceathrar leanaí acu, is iad sin beirt chailíní agus beirt bhuachaillí. Is é Martin McGuinness Príomh-Idirbheartaí Shinn Féin, agus chabhraigh sé go gníomhach le próisis síochána tearcfhorbartha eile ar fud an domhain, lena n-áirítear i Srí Lanca agus san Iaráic. Rinne Martin ionadaíocht do Shinn Féin i bplé ardleibhéil le ceannairí polaitiúla san Eoraip agus i Meiriceá freisin.

I 1997, toghadh Martin mar MP do thoghcheantar Lár-Uladh agus toghadh arís é i 2001 agus i 2005.

I 1998 agus i 2003, toghadh ar an Tionól é don toghcheantar céanna. D'éirigh sé ina Aire Oideachais sa Tionól nua i mí na Samhna 1999 agus fuair sé an-mholadh as a chuid oibre.

I mí na Bealtaine, 2007, ceapadh Martin mar Chomh-Chéad-Aire sa Choiste Feidhmiúcháin áitiúil; ó shin i leith, tá a cheannaireacht sa tír thar na bearta. Ó chuaigh sé isteach in Oifig an Chéad-Aire agus an LeasChéad-Aire i dteannta Gerry Kelly den chéad uair, lean Martin air oibriú go han-dícheallach chun soláthar a dhéanamh do shaoránaigh ar fud an tuaiscirt, lena n-áirítear infheistíocht dhíreach eacnamaíoch a mhealladh trí mhórchomhdhálacha infheistíochta eacnamaíche a óstáil, caidreamh idirnáisiúnta a chothú, dul i ngleic go gníomhach le seicteachas, le ciníochas agus le biogóideachas agus caidreamh trasphobail a fhorbairt.

Francie Molloy

Francie Molloy has been a political activist since the Civil Rights campaign and was the Director of Elections for Bobby Sands in 1981.

First elected in 1985 to Dungannon Council, Francie was selected as Mayor in 2001 and was part of the negotiating team which brought about the Good Friday and St Andrews Agreements.

Francie held the position of Principal Deputy Speaker of the Assembly and sat on the OFM /dFM Committee. He represented the Assembly on the EU Committee of the Regions to give the Assembly an input into new EU legislation and CAP reform. Francie also sat on the Agriculture Committee to ensure the rural way of life and countryside sports.

In March this year, Francie was elected MP for Mid-Ulster to replace Martin McGuinness and in line with party policy has vacated his Assembly seat.

Tá Francie Molloy ina ghníomhaíoch polaitiúil ón bhfeachtas Cearta Sibhialta agus bhí sé mar Stiúrthóir toghchán do Bobby Sands i 1981.

Toghadh Francie den chéad uair ar Chomhairle Dhún Geanainn i 1985 agus roghnaíodh é mar Mhéara i 2001. Bhí sé páirteach san fhoireann idirbheartaíochta a sholáthair Comhaontú Aoine an Chéasta agus Comhaontú Chill Rìmhinn.

Bhí an post ag Francie mar Leas-Spéicéir ar bhonn Prionsabail an Tionóil agus d'fhóin sé ar choiste Oifig an Chéad-Aire agus an LeasChéad-Aire. Rinne sé ionadaíocht don Tionól ar Choiste na Réigiún chun ionchur a thabhairt don Tionól maidir le reachtaíocht nua an AE agus le hathchóiriú an Chomhbheartais Talmhaíochta. D'fhóin Francie freisin ar an gcoiste Talmhaíochta chun modh maireachtála tuaithe agus spóirt faoin tuath a chinntiú.

I mí an Mhárta i mbliana, toghadh Francie teacht i ndiaidh Martin McGuinness mar MP do thoghcheantar Lár-Uladh agus, i gcomhréir le polasaí an pháirtí, d'éirigh sé as a shuíochán sa Tionól.



Conor Murphy

In 1998, following eight years of service as a local councillor, Conor Murphy was elected to the Assembly. In 2005, Conor became the first Irish republican MP for Newry/Armagh, a position to which he was re-elected in 2010.

Conor has held positions such as Sinn Féin Chief Whip and MLA Group Leader. He is a key member of Sinn Féin's negotiating team. Conor held the position of Minister for Regional Development from 2007 to 2011.

Having been successfully re-elected to the Assembly in 2011 by topping the poll for the Newry/Armagh constituency, Conor recently resigned his MLA seat to concentrate on his role as MP for Newry/Armagh.



A married family man and lifelong Camlough resident, Conor plays an active role in community life, participating in local GAA and various triathlon, swimming and cycling competitions.

I 1998, tar éis dó obair ar feadh ocht mbliana mar chomhairleoir áitiúil, toghadh Conor Murphy ar an Tionól. I 2005, bhí Conor ar an gcéad MP Poblachtach Éireannach do thoghcheantar an Iúir/Ard Mhacha, post ar ar toghadh é athuair i 2010.

Bhí poist mar Phríomh-Aoire Shinn Féin agus mar Cheannaire Grúpa MLA ag Conor agus tá sé ina bhall tábhachtach d'fhoireann idirbheartaíochta Shinn Féin freisin. Bhí an post mar Aire Forbartha Réigiúnaí ag Conor ó 2007 go 2011.

Toisc gur toghadh ar an Tionól athuair i 2011 trí bhíthin na vótaí is mó a ghnóthú do thoghcheantar an Iúir/Ard Mhacha, d'éirigh Conor as a shuíochán mar MLA chun díriú a aigne ar a ról mar MP don Iúir/Ard Mhacha.

Is fear teaghlaigh pósta agus cónaitheoir i gCamloch ar feadh a shaoil é Conor agus imríonn sé ról gníomhach i saol an phobail trí pháirt a ghlacadh sa CLG áitiúil agus i gcomórtais éagsúla Trí-atlain Snámha agus Rothaíochta.

Seán Murray

Seán Murray is currently a member of the Political Directorate of Cúige Uladh. He also has responsibility for Trade Union Affairs at directorate level, while chairing the Cúige Uladh Centenaries Commemoration Group. He has been a republican activist for over 40 years, having been interned in Long Kesh in the 1970s and served a 12-year sentence in the H-Blocks in the 1980s.

Seán is also a community activist, sitting on a number of partnership boards and cross-community forums. He co-ordinates the party's approach to contentious loyal order and band parades. He has been to the forefront on this issue across the Six Counties for many years, articulating the residents' perspective while negotiating on their behalf in a number of disputes.



He also sits on a number of interface forums which provide opportunities for outreach and the resolution of contentious issues.

Having served four years on the board of SafeFood, a North-South body set up under the Good Friday Agreement, Lynn Ní Bhaoighealláin now holds the position of Chair, a role she continues to use to progress the need for further co-operation between the two jurisdictions in the areas of food production, food safety and nutrition. Qualified as an ecologist for over a decade, she now works in community development in Ballymun, Dublin, where she is the community project co-ordinator with an environmental NGO. When not working as a party activist in Tallaght she is studying welfare, crime and social justice as part of a BSc in Social Science. Lynn stood for Sinn Féin in the 2007 general election and the 2009 local elections in South Kerry.

Carál Ní Chuilín has been an active republican all her adult life. A republican former prisoner, Carál was co-ordinator of Tar Anall, a political ex-prisoners and family centre for ten years.

Carál was co-opted to Belfast City Council in 2003 before being elected as an MLA to represent the Oldpark ward in north Belfast in 2007. Carál was Party Whip during her first term in the Assembly. She was re-elected in 2011

Carál has been Minister of Culture, Arts and Leisure in the Assembly since May 2011. In addition to being a lifelong political activist, Carál has a particular interest in human rights, housing, community development and the Irish language.

More recently, Liadh was the only candidate selected from Ireland to participate in a prestigious European Diploma in Cultural Project Management.



In her role as National Gaeilge Officer, Liadh is committed to putting all things Gaeilge back on the agenda. "I believe that Sinn Féin should be recognised as a party which supports and nurtures our rich, creative resources. We have a unique ability to connect with ordinary people and it is up to us to promote and build an inclusive and united Ireland with equal rights for all."

He has extensive experience in the areas of community development, media and the arts.

He is the Sinn Féin local representative for the Carrigaline LEA, having been the local election candidate in 2009, polling 1,502 votes and narrowly missing a seat. He is founder of the Gleann na Bóinne Greenway Development Campaign, the Meath Community Against Cuts, An Euro Gaelach and Irish Emigrants Speak Up.

Peadar was the founding Cathaoirleach of the Dáil Committee on Investigations, Oversight & Petitions. He is now Sinn Féin's representative on the Joint Oireachtas Committee on Jobs, Enterprise and Innovation, and the Joint Oireachtas Committee on the Environment, Transport, Culture and the Gaeltacht. He is a Sinn Féin representative on the British Irish Parliamentary Assembly

Peadar has published legislation in support of stronger JLC structures, legislation that would promote stronger employee rights and legislation that would bring about the end of upward-only rents.

He is a current member of the Ard Chomhairle and supports greater Ard Fheis representation on the Ard Chomhairle.

Tá Peadar ina bhunaitheoir agus ina Chathaoirleach ar an bhFeachtas 'Fóir ar Ospidéal na hUaimhe'.
