

THIS IS NO GOVERNMENT FOR CHANGE NÍ RIALTAS É SEO AR SON ATHRAITHE

The Programme for Government 2020, the basis of the government formed by Fine Gael, Fianna Fáil and the Green Party, falls far short of the change that people voted for in the February general election.

A stark example is the section – Mission "A Shared Island" which fails to set out any plan or mission. This is a wasted opportunity to propose an inclusive process to plan for the future. Republicans and nationalists in all parties and none are angry and disappointed that the 2020 Programme for Government failed to even mention Irish Unity or a United Ireland. This impresses no one, including unionists in the North.

Sinn Féin is fully invested in and committed to the Good Friday Agreement. Successive governments played a role in negotiating this and subsequent agreements and can rightly claim ownership, with others, for the commitments contained in them.

Why then do the parties in this government refuse to implement the commitments they were part of shaping? The people of the island North and South voted for them and the coalition parties were among those that campaigned for that vote.

Article 3 '1' of Bunreacht na hÉireann states;

"It is the firm will of the Irish nation in harmony and friendship to unite all the people who share the territory of the island of Ireland, in all the diversity of their identities and traditions, recognising that a United Ireland shall be brought about only by peaceful means with the consent of the majority of the people, democratically expressed in both jurisdictions on the island ..."

The Programme for Government does not fulfil this constitutional obligation.

Sinn Fein proposes the following steps be taken within 6 months;

- Establish a Joint Oireachtas Committee on Irish Unity.
- Convene an all-island representative Citizen's Assembly or appropriate Forum to discuss and plan for Irish Unity.
- Publish a White Paper on Unity.
- Initiate a process to secure the referendum on Irish Unity as committed to in the Good Friday Agreement.

Civic society across the island has been calling in increasing numbers for a 'new conversation' about the future constitutional arrangements for the island of Ireland.

There is a legal and international obligation on an Irish government to fully implement the Good Friday Agreement. This means going beyond the rhetoric of the last two decades. It means delivering.

Tá Sinn Féin infheistithe go hiomlán i gComhaontú Aoine an Chéasta agus tiomanta dó freisin. Bhí ról ag rialtas i ndiaidh rialtais san idirbheartaíocht ar a shon seo agus tá sé de cheart acu úinéireacht a mhaíomh, i dteannta le go leor eile, ar na héilimh atá istigh iontu.



Ógra Shinn Féin hosted a zoom meeting on Irish Unity for its members. It was well attended with over 50 participants. There will be more online meetings for discussion and planning on the Irish unity campaign and the role that Ógra will play in it. Ogra's digital campaign includes videos, graphics and their members views on Irish unity and what it means for them. The campaign has been received well on social media and it is clear that the desire for Irish Unity is growing among the youth of Ireland. Ógra organised a bilateral discussion "2020: The End of the Union", with Plaid Ifanc (Plaid Cymru Youth) to discuss Irish Unity and Welsh Independence. It was live streamed on the Ógra Shinn Féin Facebook page on July Ist.

"Brexit and the coronavirus are stoking the fires of Welsh nationalism" is the headline of an interview with Adam Price, leader of Plaid Cymru.

In spite of Wales voting to leave the EU, Price says there is a growing realisation that making their own decisions on how to deal with the virus has re-awaked a desire for independence and he believes that they will get a referendum by 2030.

IRELAND'S FUTURE

The Single European Market, the Good Friday Agreement, demographic changes in the North, Brexit, EU membership, the Coronavirus and political pressure, are all factors shaping a national debate about a new and independent Ireland and provoking answers to some key questions: Is a united Ireland economically viable and can we afford an Irish national Health Service were the two featured recently in an online debate organised by the Ireland's Future group It brought three distinguished commentators together to answer these and other questions: leading trade unionist, Patricia Mc Keown and economists David Mc Williams and Paul Gosling. On the all-Ireland economy and health service the answer to affordability was a resounding Yes in the panel's opinion.

The panel concluded that it is the political will and a plan that is now needed, led by the Irish government and including all stakeholders, to move the debate on to affirmative action.

The group held a second panel discussion in June. Brexit: The Irish Protocol, which featured journalist Martina Devlin, RTE's Tony Connolly, the writer and broadcaster Brian Feeney and trade unionist Owen Reidy. It was crystal ball gazing time for these experienced commentators unravelling the British government's plan or lack thereof. But infrastructure is needed for an EU scrutinised system of checks on goods at EU designated entry ports in Belfast, Larne and Warrenpoint to protect the integrity of the EU's single market, food safety, animal health and tax revenue on goods. The uncertainty is adding to the debate about a date for the referendum on Irish Unity and on membership of the EU for all of Ireland. The political turbulence generated by Brexit in 2016 continues apace and will do so for the foreseeable future.

WEATHER DOES NOT STOP AT BORDERS!

Sinn Féin Senator Niall Ó Donghaile's recent engagement with Met Éireann has resulted in emergency weather alerts now being issued on an all -Ireland basis. "Weather doesn't stop at borders and people need to be informed. I am pleased that Met Éireann has responded with this common sense approach. It is a welcome step in the right all-Ireland direction."
