

IRISH UNITY WITHIN TOUCHING DISTANCE


Uachtarán Shinn Féin Mary Lou McDonald has said a united Ireland is "within touching distance" following the announcement that Stormont could be restored by the end of this week.

Mary Lou McDonald said that the expected restoration of power sharing in the wake of a deal between the DUP and British government came amid a "historical turning of the wheel" that would unite the island.

Mary Lou said,

"In historic terms, it is within touching distance and I think that is a very exciting thing and I hope people will find that a very welcoming conversation.

"This will be a moment of very great significance, not simply because we haven't had government for so long but because it will be the first time that we will have a Sinn Féin first minister, a nationalist first minister.

Michelle Gildernew MP said:

- "The Fermanagh Peoples' Assembly is a unique opportunity for Fermanagh citizens to join in the debate about a united Ireland.
- "Irish Unity is not inevitable. It needs to be planned for. That means those of us who want Irish Unity planning for it. We must also address the concerns of those who have not yet made up their minds, and are unsure how they would vote in a unity referendum.
- "Citizens, regardless of whether they are nationalist or unionist or none of these, want to know what the new Ireland will mean for them and their families. They want answers and reassurance on priorities such as governmental structures, health service provision, jobs and pensions.
- "That's why Sinn Féin believes the Irish government should organise a Citizen's Assembly where these matters and others can be discussed. "However, there is also an onus on all of us who support unity to encourage the debate. To reach out to those who oppose unity or who aren't convinced of its merits.
- "This People's Assembly is an opportunity for individuals, business and community organisations, language groups, farming organisations, trade unions and others across Fermanagh to have their say on the future.

COUNCIL IRISH UNITY WORKING GROUP UPDATE

The Derry and Strabane Council Irish Unity Working Group met last week. At the well-attended meeting councillors received an analysis of the open online consultation with ratepayers on Irish Unity that was conducted in April of this year, to which there were over 200 submissions. It was agreed that the outcome of the consultation will be published in the coming weeks.

Contact with officials in Donegal County Council which also has established a Working Group on Irish Unity has also been made. We hope to arrange a meeting soon to discuss potential joint initiatives. The Working Group then moved on to discuss next steps. It was agreed to hold a consultation with various sectors such as business, education, health, and Trade Unions etc. They would be invited in to tell the Working Group what they would like to see for their sector in a New Ireland in the event of constitutional change.

A report will be published following the completion of the consultation programme. This is likely to be in the summer.

A request has also been sent to the Shared Island Unit to present to the Council the work that they have been doing on planning for constitutional change.

The Sinn Féin team in Brussels recently hosted a delegation of Sinn Féin members from across Ireland. The theme of this visit was the future of our island as 2024 kicks off a string of elections.

The first set of elections will be the Local and European Parliament Elections in June. These elections are often viewed as a midterm review of how the sitting government is doing.

There was consensus among members of the delegation that the issue of the referendum and the need for the Irish government to establish a Citizens' Assembly should feature in the election. We are nearing a referendum on the reunification of Ireland and so it is crucial that we return as many as pro-Unity MEPs as possible in the upcoming European Parliament Elections.

As we embark on this season of elections - Let us do so with refreshed confidence that Irish Unity is on the horizon.

THE NORTH'S FUTURE MUST BE WITHIN THE EU AS PART OF A UNITED IRELAND

Sinn Féin has announced that MP and former Agriculture Minister Michelle Gildernew is to seek a nomination to stand for Sinn Féin in the Midlands-North West constituency in the upcoming European elections.

Speaking following the announcement, Michelle Gildernew said:

"The European Union is crucially important to Ireland. Ireland needs to be the fore in setting the direction of the European Union in the years ahead, and I want to play a role in making that happen by bringing my experience of negotiation and dealing with EU institutions as a former Agriculture Minister to the job of standing up for

Irish interests in the European Parliament. "The European Union played a key role in ensuring Brexit did not create a hard border in Ireland, and I believe the North's future must be within the European Union as part of a United Ireland.

"Ireland needs stronger representatives in the European Parliament. A strong Sinn Féin team will call out the EU when needed if it is not acting in the best interest of the Irish people or when EU office holders overstep their remit as the EU Commission President did in recent months.


